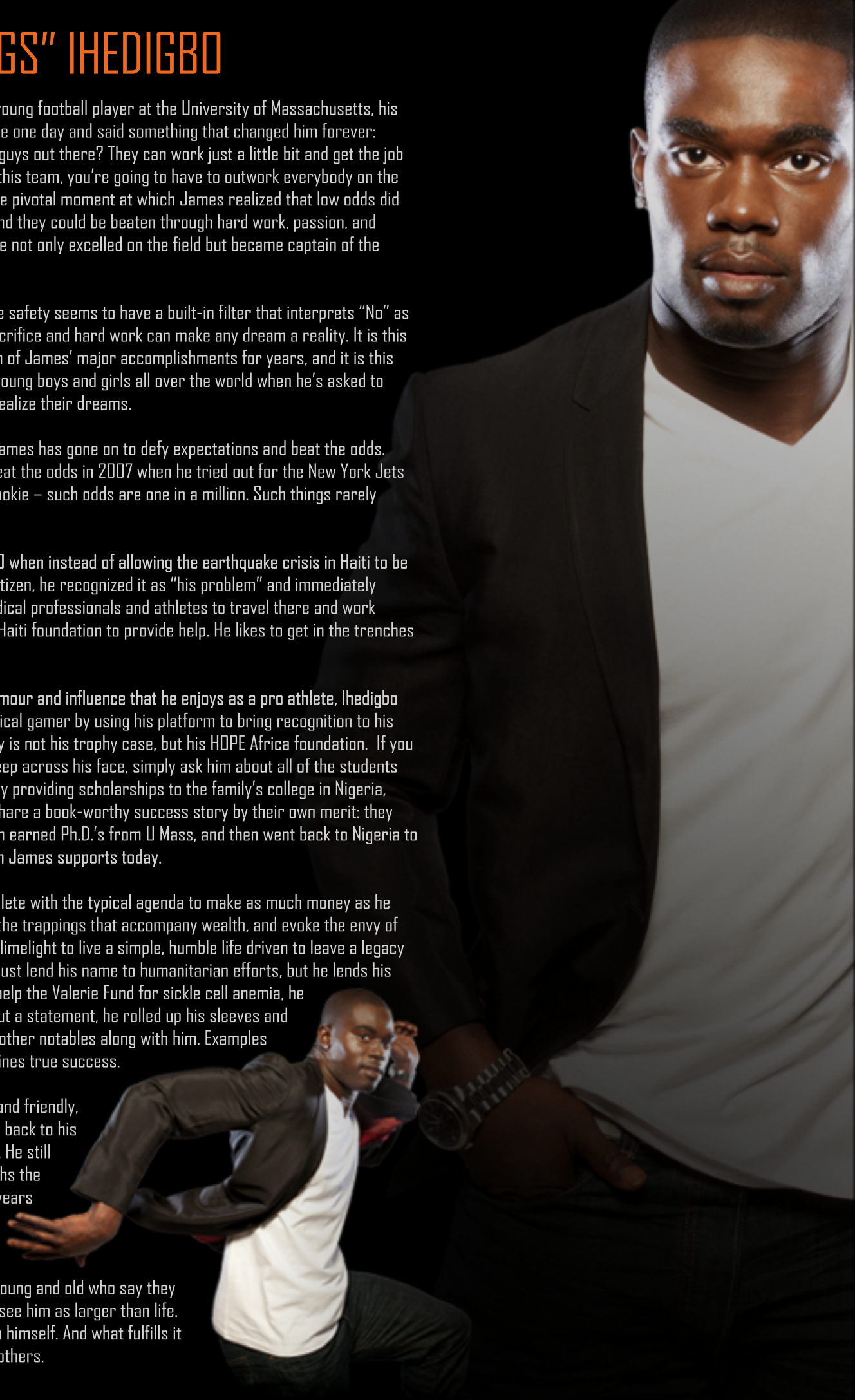

If you want to see a broad smile creep across his face, simply ask him about all of the students that HOPE Africa has helped by providing scholarships to the family's college in Nigeria, founded by his parents who share a book-worthy success story by their own merit: they immigrated from Nigeria, both earned Ph.D.'s from U Mass, and then went back to Nigeria to found their own college, which James supports today.

James is not a typical pro athlete with the typical agenda to make as much money as he can, conspicuously consume the trappings that accompany wealth, and evoke the envy of others. Instead, he shuns the limelight to live a simple, humble life driven to leave a legacy of helping others. He doesn't just lend his name to humanitarian efforts, but he lends his hands. When it came time to help the Valerie Fund for sickle cell anemia, he didn't have his publicist roll out a statement, he rolled up his sleeves and donated blood – and brought other notables along with him. Examples like these are how James defines true success.

He's unexpectedly touchable and friendly, and he actually enjoys writing back to his fans on Twitter and Facebook. He still signs and sends out autographs the old fashioned way. And after years in the NFL, he's still deeply, genuinely touched by letters painstakingly written in their neatest handwriting by fans young and old who say they want to be just like him. They see him as larger than life. He sees his life as larger than himself. And what fulfills it most is changing the lives of others.
